MELLS WITH VOBSTER

TERRY YORKE, OF BULLS GREEN, CHANTRY, BORN ON MAY 2^{ND} 1935 AND DIED ON APRIL 14TH 2024, AGED 88

A service was held in St. Andrew's Church on May 2nd, which would have been Terry's 89th birthday.

Terry came from a farming family in Foxcote. He and Jenny were married at St. Andrew's and lived for some years in The Duckery, in Mells Park, where Jenny's father had worked. Terry was Secretary of the Mells Flower Show. He and Jenny had four children, Martin died at a year old, Rachel, died at four years, and then they had Brendon. When Brendon was three, Terry and Jenny moved to Asham House, little more than a ruin, on the outskirts of Chantry. They lived in a caravan for some years while Terry gradually built a home from the row of derelict cottages. Later on they adopted Simon, a Rubella child, greatly loved, who died at the age of 21. Jenny led the Brownie pack in Mells, and when Brendon was of an age to become a Scout, Terry resurrected the Mells Troop which he ran for some years. He was a man of firm convictions and in retirement was a fundraiser for Marie Curie Charity,



covering a huge area. When Jenny died some six years ago, Terry was really knocked back. He had cared for her for the last part of her life, and although assisted by carers and by Brendon, he was drained. To distract himself he turned beautiful wooden objects, nurtured orchids, continued to drive, found great joy in attending the wedding of his granddaughter Rebecca. Terry was admitted to the RUH in Bath in January following a fall, when it was discovered that his cancer had spread. He was transferred to Frome Community Hospital for palliative care. Brendon was at his side every day. Our prayers and thoughts are for his family at this time. May Terry rest in peace, and rise in Glory.



Revised waste collection routes: Recycling and rubbish collection days are changing from Monday June 17th for households in eastern parts of the county.

Roadside grass-cutting: From May 2024, where safe to do so, mowing routines across managed highway verges, open spaces, country parks and council property grounds will be reduced although safety and visibility around verges and public spaces such as play areas will be cut more regularly. On wider verges, only one meter swathe is mowed, leaving the rest untouched to maintain biodiversity. Further information on the cutting schedule can be found at somerset.gov.uk/roads-travel-and-parking/grass-cutting/

Children and Young Peoples Plan: The new Children and Young People's Plan (CYPP) for Somerset sets out the Council's aims for 2024-2030. Members of Somerset Youth Forum have suggested that the most important priorities are - Having a better experience in education, leading healthier live, help to improve your mental health, living in safer communities, building better relationships and being prepared for adulthood. The Council wants to encourage all individuals under the age of 25 to share their thoughts on these priories via the online survey: forms.office.com/e/dNHr44HCfn

Volunteer Drivers: Volunteer drivers in Somerset have reduced by about 67 per cent in recent years. These dedicated drivers provide essential transportation services to residents, especially those who



live in rural areas with little public transport. If you have at least half a day available and a car, please consider volunteering. Volunteer drivers receive training and are reimbursed expenses at 45p per mile (or 50p per mile with passengers).

MATTERS ARISING

Crates by defibrillator – Post Office: The shop is looking at either moving the bin slightly to allow the crates to be placed by it or placing them at the back of the shop if the plans to erect some new storage goes ahead.

Trees overhanging telephone lines – Little Green: Clerk to contact Openreach. 'Queens Canopy' – tree planting: Cllr Asquith confirmed that some tress will be planted at Longfield.

Quarry noise: This appears to mainly affect just a few houses which are in direct line of the quarry. The main issue reported by Cllr Asquith is the grinding of the lorry gears as they negotiate the steep climb up to the surface with the stock at night. Cllr West will investigate if the quarry is able to move the stock to the surface in the afternoon or to another place to avoid the movements in the middle of the night. Noise is at its worse when the wind is south westerly.

HIGHWAY AND FOOTPATH ISSUES:

Stone baskets on Park Corner: Cllr Henderson reported that he has raised the matter with the quarry as the area is on their boundary.

Fingerposts by Vobster Inn and leaning post top of Conduit Hill: Cllr West will take a look at what is required to straighten the one at the top of Conduit Hill and remove the vegetation. The painting contractor is arranging for someone to fix the moving post at Vobster.

PLANNING

New applications:

2024/0620/FUL: Erection of dwelling and creation of parking, turning and access area – Prospect Cottage, Top Lane. Clerk to request that the parking area is created prior to the work to enable the works vans to be parked off the road.

2024/0661/CLP: Application for a proposed lawful development certificate for stationing of mobile home within the garden of Bridge Cottage – Bridge Cottage, Holes Lane. Clerk to request that provision for parking for the mobile home should be made on the site.

SCC/4095/2024: Restoration of Lime Kiln Hill Quarry – Lime Kiln Quarry – no objections. The access point further up the hill is considered an improvement.

2024/0823/HSE: Small utility room extension, front and rear porches, modifications of some openings – Rock Edge, Mells Green to Little Green – no objections.

Quarry applications:

SCC/3837/2021/IDO: This permission covers the Asham Wood void area and extends across an area of 32.3ha – This application was formally withdrawn on 7 May 2024.

CORRESPONDENCE:

Fast traffic by Claveys Farm: Resident has raised concerns regarding the speed of traffic in this area. Clerk to look into what is required to have speed camera signs placed on the 30mph post in the hope this will deter drivers. Post meeting note: PSCO Louise Perry has reported that there were over 50 prosecutions in Mells for speeding in 2023.

ITEMS TO REPORT / ITEMS FOR NEXT AGENDA

War memorial: The war memorial is looking untidy due to a change at the Walled Garden. It is hoped that the contractor who will be employed to cut the grass triangle, will be willing to undertake its maintenance.

Fete: This was a great success. The 'entry' fee system is actually illegal and a donation should have been requested.
