JOTTINGS FROM A COUNTRY CHURCHYARD

I LOVE AUTUMN. It's my favourite season, although November this year has been rather damp and soggy. But we mustn't complain, remembering the terrible floods in Spain and other places. I look forward to Spring, with its renewal of life and flowery surprise but it's the anticipation of it that I enjoy. I find the reality too fraught with restlessness and promises so often unfulfilled. Autumn for me is a time of quiet reflection and contentment – the end of anxieties such as will the weather be fine for outside events commitments, will I have unexpected guests when I am in the middle of a pile of ironing, washing my hair or the lawn needs mowing? In the shorter days of autumn there is less chance of distant visitors so one can invite local friends, light the log fire, ignore the lawn and exchange local chat or "put the world to rights" as my Mum would say.

At this time of year, too, I love my long garden path. It is flanked with a huge beech on one side and a Spanish sweet chestnut on the other. Between them the copper pennies of the beech and the serrated ovals of the chestnut form a golden carpet winding through overarching shrubs from my rickety iron gate to my hidden house. And if we get a few dry sunny days I have the joy of scuffling through the leaves and beechmast revelling in the rustle and crunch like an aged toddler, alongside my beloved dog, Ebbie, who wears her years more gracefully and thinks, no doubt, that I am quite mad.

As I write this in mid-November, we are fast approaching Advent in the church calendar. I have just finished refreshing and re-dressing the Advent wreath,

something I enjoy doing every year. The fat (and expensive) red candles which have done many years of service are growing a bit short so I have experimented by adding a block of polystyrene glued to the bases and covered in red tape to match the candles. The extensions sink into the candle-holders, hidden by foliage, and will give at least a couple more year of burning time so I was quite pleased with the result. At my age (92) a couple of years is as far as I can optimistically plan so perhaps when the time comes for candle replacements it will be someone else's problem.

Talking of looking ahead, another thing I do at this time of year is walk around all my old trees, especially the ancient apple trees in the orchard, telling them to rest well and sleep quietly though the winter and wake refreshed and renewed in Spring. And I tell them "I will be here to see you" as much to reassure myself as for their benefit. I have been so blessed with good health up to now – it is two and half years since my cancer op and as far as I know I am "fit as flea" (well as a fit as a 92-year-old flea anyway). But circumstances can change in an instant so I keep praying "Please Lord, don't send the bill in yet", there is still so much I need to do. But, season by season, I feel I mustn't be greedy and ungrateful.

Oh dear! All this and I haven't mentioned the churchyard yet. There, like everywhere else at the moment, is a season of calm and little happening. By the time the next 5Alive appears in February the grass will be laced with thousands of snowdrops, patched with clusters of pale mauve crocus and the worms and wind will have removed most of the huge hand-shaped leaves beneath the conker tree. That tree, like its companions, is now showing its beautiful bone structure. Its cloak of of summer leaves now shed, each tree exposes its individual silhouette and whatever birds are around are easier to spot among the branches.

#### MRS JULIA (JULIE) DAWKINS, 1960-2024

On Wednesday November 6th a funeral service took place in St Michael's Church, Buckland Dinham, to celebrate the life of Julie Dawkins.

From 10 o'clock onwards a steady stream of colleagues, friends and family began to arrive until by the time the service began at 11.00, the church was packed full, a tribute to the many people Julie had touched throughout her life.

The service was conducted by the Reverend Pauline Reid. The coffin was carried in to the music of Andrea Bocelli singing *Ave Maria*. Hymns were *Morning has broken* and *Abide with me*.

Julia's son Tom gave the eulogy, recalling Julie's childhood in the 60's and 70's and her love of the pop icons of the time, such as the Bay City Rollers and David Cassidy. At the age of 17, Julie joined Cooper and Tanners as a junior assistant and stayed there for the rest of her working life. This loyalty was typical of Julie, who went on to become a loving wife to Simon and mother to Tom and Sophie, with a wide circle of friends and colleagues. In later life Julie enjoyed hiking and travelling and walking in Italy. The eulogy was followed by a poem chosen by Simon, Leo Marks' *The life that I have is all that I have.* 

For her scripture reading, the Reverend Pauline chose the famous passage from 1 Corinthians 13 about the importance of love. She reflected that although this was usually chosen for weddings, it was very fitting for Julie since she was so beloved throughout her life. In particular, Julie's family meant everything to her. Pauline went on to reflect on how to deal with the pain of loss, something God understands and shares with us. While is it is unbelievably hard, it is important to remember that the love Julie's friends and family shared with her will never be lost and will continue to nurture and sustain them. The coffin was carried out to a recording of Bocelli's *Time to say goodbye*, to be buried in St Michael's churchyard. Our thoughts and prayers are with Julie's family and friends at this time. The Christmas eve Mass will be at 10.00pm (which is midnight Bethlehem Time). We hope to see you then, the service being followed with mince pies and hot drinks.



# MELLS WITH VOBSTER

#### MARGARET HOUSE 1942 – 2024

Friends and Family gathered in St Andrews on November 11th to remember the life of Margaret House.

The reading "She's gone" was read by Sue Johns and "Remember me" by Toby Butler.



Margaret lived in Kent, the Forest of Dean and then Somerset. Here the wider family would come for get togethers, for support in times of trouble and need. Such times Margaret experienced herself. It was devastating for the family when her sister died in her thirties, and there was more sadness for Margaret when Philip died shortly after they married.

Margaret was helped through her sorrow by the delights of her lifelong devotion to soft coated wheaten terriers. Gail her daughter was familiar in 1969 with the notion of women leaving work to have a child, but she knew of no one else whose Mum left work to have a puppy. Margaret devoted a great deal of time, energy and ingenuity to improving the breed, right down to the detailed level of eradicating a genetic flaw in the dogs. She was a judge at Crufts' and at shows all over the world. 2019 saw the remarkable achievement of spending 50 years in close association with the breed. Margaret last move was to Okehampton to be closer to her daughter Gail. She continued to travel to shows visiting Holland and Ireland and driving up and down the country. Although she could not visit her son Gareth and his family in New Zealand she maintained online contact for as long as possible after their visit in 2022. Margaret was laid to rest in Mells churchyard with her husband Philip. RIP

#### JOHN (JACK) INCH 1933 - 2024

Friends and Family gathered in St Andrews on November 18th to remember the life of John Inch known to all as Jack. Readings were "Jack" by Jackie Inch, Revelations Chapter 21: verse 1-7 by Christian Davis and "Your Father" by Anthony Inch



Jack was born in the "Potteries" Staffordshire, Stoke on Trent, so he inherited a collection of pottery and was a lifelong supporter of Stoke on Trent FC from an early age.

He worked for Ken Andrews and then Lime Kiln Quarry where he had a great group of friends.

In 1973 Jack and Shirley fostered a beautiful baby boy called Antia better known as Anthony, eventually he lived with them permanently and called them "the Rescuers" becoming Jack's sidekick in the lorry.

Dogs were a big feature in family life with a succession of various breeds passing through the family. Then along came grandchildren Christian, John, Jason, Holly and Ben. Sports and food and frolics are fondly remembered in the times spent with Grandad Jack. He was also an accomplished wood worker and supported Shirley with her causes including running a youth club together. A proud moment for Jack was in 2013 when Christian asked him to be his best man. Great grandchildren Jack, Millie, Jane and Alfie were also given the loving treatment.

#### NOTES OF MELLS PARISH COUNCIL HELD ON TUESDAY NOVEMBER 12TH 2024 (Full minutes can be found at mellsparishcouncil.org.uk) SOMERSET COUNCIL - COUNCILLOR'S REPORT:

**Winter Fuel Payments:** In a move to safeguard vulnerable older residents, Somerset Council overwhelmingly passed a motion to oppose the Government's changes to the Winter Fuel Allowance.

**Recycling:** Somerset Council has been given the green-light to roll out the collection of plastic bags and wrapping to more than 25,000 households. From October 2024 a further 25,000 residents in and around Wells, Draycott, Frome and Chilcompton will benefit from getting these hard to recycle plastics collected from home.

**Sale of Disposable Vapes:** The sale of disposable vapes is to be made illegal from June 1st 2025. There are currently five million sold weekly, each of which contains a lithium battery which cause frequent fires in recycling trucks and centres.

**Overspend for year:** This is calculated as ranging from £66 to £169 million as unforeseen issues and demands on finances cannot be quantified.

**Planning:** This is in a dire state at present with applications not being given approval for years in some cases. There is also no enforcement strategy in place. Both issues are hoped to be in a better position in the next year or so.

**Household support grant:** Grants of up to £1,000 are still available.

**Council tax relief:** Relief for those on benefit is under review and it is likely the single persons council tax relief will be reviewed too.

**Barn lease:** The lease has been agreed and is ready to sign. The parish council will continue as the leaseholders for the Barn.





This offer is more appealing for the directors to take on lease themselves and would release the parish council from their obligations. However, it was agreed that subject to S137 conditions and ongoing budget constraints, the parish council would be willing to continue their financial support as currently the income from the Recreation Ground is not sufficient to sustain the long term future although other income opportunities are being considered.

**Quarry noise:** Cllr West was contacted by a resident one evening regarding the quarry noise at their house. Cllr West agreed that the noise was worse in the garden than on the road which was probably due to the enclosed nature of the garden although he did not believe it was breaking any planning permissions. The quarry will be publishing the results of a noise survey taken with handheld devices in the near future and have recently trialled an electric train. £600k has been spent on improving the rail system this year and another similar amount is budgeted for next year.

#### HIGHWAY AND FOOTPATH ISSUES:

**Speeding vehicles in Vobster:** Clerk to find out the procedure to get the speed limit reduced and whether offering some funding towards the implementation of a scheme would improve the chances of it being moved forward. Cllr Brady will speak to the police regarding the speeding vehicles. **Park Corner:** Another accident occurred on November 9th involving three cars with a police presence. Clerk to inform Highways.



#### PLANNING

**2024/1858/LBC:** Retrospective permission for additional conservation roof lights to north elevation, ground floor timber partition, first floor mezzanine and replacement of flooring at first floor – Vobster Church Studio – For the listed building consent office to decide. No objections.

#### FINANCE

**Lloyds bank account charges:** From jJanuary 14th 2025, the account will become a Community Account with a monthly charge of £4.25 for account maintenance and varying charges for other services (10p per direct debit, 7p per BACS payment, 50p per cheque). Although disappointing, the charges are considerably less than the  $\pounds$ 12/month account maintenance fee that HSBC had charged. The first 100 transactions will be free.

- **Preliminary budget and precept discussion:** The Parish Council resources will be stretched further next year due to the following expenditure that is new for the coming year:-
- Bank charges £4.25/month + additional transaction changes
- Website charges (£33/month)
- **Dog waste and litter bin emptying:** Somerset Council is withdrawing this service for any bins not owned by them. Unfortunately, all Mells bins are owned



by the PC. The current figure being given by Somerset Council to buy in the service is  $\pounds$ 12.50/bin empty. Mells has a total of 10 bins that would require emptying. At this price and continuing the fortnightly emptying schedule, the annual costs would be  $\pounds$ 3,250!! It is hoped that the two dog waste bins in Fairview would be counted as one as they are side by side and this would reduce the annual total to  $\pounds$ 2,925. The Clerk is trying to source a contractor who can provide this service more cheaply as it an essential service.

#### ITEMS TO REPORT / ITEMS FOR NEXT AGENDA

**Trees in Vobster graveyard:** Concerns were raised that these may cause issue an issue as they get bigger and damage the boundary wall. As the church is a listed building the wall is within the curtilage of that listing damage to the wall needs to be prevented.

**Damaged bridge:** As the bridge has been in disrepair for a while, the warning orange tape has become entangled with brambles which need removing to ensure the tape is visible and fit for purpose. Clerk to contact Highways.

**Vobster Cross junction:** Clerk to request reinstatement of the give way markings.

**Speeding traffic – Lime Kiln Hill:** Cllr Brady has contacted the local MP requesting calming measures and the police witnessed vehicles approaching the village at a speed deemed to be over the limit.

**Wooden fingerposts:** Cllr Brady is assessing the work required. Somerset Council will supply new posts if required.

**Signs:** Thanks were extended to Cllr Brady for continuing to clean the signs around the village




