

### **Garden waste renewals due**

Residents who subscribe to the kerbside [garden waste collection service](#) are reminded that they need to re-subscribe to ensure collection. Renewal reminders are being sent to subscribers from their local council with details of prices and how to subscribe.

The garden waste bin or sack can be used to recycle flowers, plants and weeds with grass cuttings, leaves and hedge trimmings, as well as branches up to 10cm wide. The service also accepts straw or sawdust if used as bedding from vegetarian pets, such as rabbits, but not soil or food waste. After being shredded and rotting down in massive windrows, Somerset's composted garden waste is sold as the [Revive soil improver](#), available from every recycling site.

### **Weekly refuse collection review**

SWP is continuing to review the last remaining kerbside weekly refuse collections in the town centres of Minehead, Porlock, Taunton, Watchet and Wellington. This follows the successful switch of weekly refuse collections from hundreds of households to fortnightly in central Bridgwater and Burnham-on-Sea during autumn 2015.

This will bring their collections in line with the service supplied to the vast majority of the county's 250,000 homes. The residents affected will be written to, and local councillors and customer services briefed. Provision of refuse collections for communal properties in the affected areas will not change.

### **Getting ready for spring**

The current offer, available until the end of March, has compost bins starting from only £17.98 (plus delivery at £5.99) and you can also buy one and get one half-price.

## Christmas waste collections

A third more waste than usual was presented for collection over the festive fortnight, compared with two weeks at another time of year. Once again, cardboard topped the list in terms of volumes set out. The growth in cardboard is more acute during the festive season but this reflects a continuing year-on-year trend due to the expansion of internet shopping.

With more of all types of materials presented, contractor Kier reported a particularly noticeable hike in the amount of food and glass being presented over the period.

The vast majority of collections were completed as scheduled with no major mishaps. A small number of rounds could not be completed on the scheduled day but were caught up within a day or two.

Recycling and rubbish collection crews and management did sterling work, involving long hours in sometimes very poor weather. SWP has both appreciated and acknowledged this performance, expressing thanks on behalf of all residents.
