the name of the product I needed while suffering cramp. How <u>could</u> I forget such a simple thing? I eventually drifted off to sleep, satisfied that I had remembered – of course – amnesium. In the morning, I recalled the proper name but then I thought, wouldn't it be wonderful if one could take a pill called amnesium for loss of memory? That would <u>really</u> be useful. I expect everyone has noticed the bountiful supply of fruit and berries on every previously flowering tree and bush. Everything flowered its socks off in spring and summer and although most things were early there were somehow enough pollinators around to do their job as the resultant fruits have proved. Perhaps bees awoke early? Local beekeepers would know. I must ask Jan. I know some have had to feed their bees to compensate for when the bees were unable to fly because of heavy rain. I do remember seeing many bumble bees much earlier than usual this year so perhaps they were lured out of hibernation earlier by early spring and blossom?

The abundance of berries now, so much too early to feed our winter migrants, such as fieldfares and redwings, may already have been gobbled up or simply left to wither when the winter birds need feeding. Wildlife is beginning to

adapt to the changing climate but not all at the same rate so it may take many generations for insect food supplies all to coincide again as needed. Some may never do to the detriment of some loved species. Think how long as it has taken hedgehogs to realise that their instinctive reaction to enemies to roll up into an uninviting ball of prickles is not the best defence from approaching cars?

But I read an article recently which illustrated how birds can adapt within our lifetime. The writer had studied blackcaps in detail over the space of 50 years. He discovered that many now overwintered in England and as a result of these birds not needing to fly huge distances to migrate their wings had grown considerably shorter than their ancestors' were in the 1970s. It makes one wonder how many other small miracles of change have occurred, unnoticed, over the course of the last 50 odd years of climate change. It would seem that we, like the flora and fauna, have to adapt to our unpredictable seasons. Younger folk probably find it easier as much of it has happened during their lifetime. But those of us who, like myself, are in sight of their century (well, in your nineties, you feel it is almost within grasp) still tend to look back and complain that "it was never like this in our young days." (Not only climate – but politics, morals, social behaviour – don't let me get started!).

I am sitting in the sun in my stable yard writing this. High up in the evergreen magnolia, which normally flowers from July till December, when frosts blacken the last buds, I can already see what appear to be the <u>last few</u>

But then she started flowering in early June this year so I can't grumble. Conversely the wisteria still has a few purple clusters of its second flowering. 

ANNE RECKLESS, 1945-2025

On Friday September 19th, 2025, a burial service took place in St Michael's Church, Buckland Dinham, to give thanks for the life of Mrs Anne Reckless. The church was full as half-muffled bells rang in the service, thanks to ringers from Corsley and Rode. The service was also streamed to Anne's family in Ireland.

For this ecumenical service, the Requiem Mass was conducted by the Reverend Canon Richard Dwyer. Anne's coffin was covered with white lilies, with two further beautiful displays at each side. Hymns were *All things Bright and Beautiful* and *The Spirit Lives to Set us Free*.

World-famous mezzo soprano Claudia Huckle accompanied by George Fradley sang *O Rest in the Lord* from Mendelssohn's Elijah as the offertory hymn, and *As with Rosy Steps the Morn* from Handel's Theodora during the communion.





Readings were 2 Corinthians 4: 6 read by Mark Reckless and the Responsorial Psalm read by Ian Reckless. Sally Reckless led the Prayers of the Faithful as part of the Mass.

The eulogy was provided by Anne's husband John, taking us through the milestones of Anne's life from her childhood in Ireland to her meeting with medical student John during her nursing training in Redhill, Surrey and her career in paediatric nursing and child advocacy. Her career was characterised by a commitment which typically went above and beyond the requirements of her role. Anne went on to become a mother herself and, in her later years, a grandmother who found great satisfaction in entertaining and engaging with her grandchildren and who kept a playroom always at the ready.

Anne approached life with energy and commitment, cherishing her friends and family and extending her interest to strangers she met on her travels. She did, John observed, like to chat!

In his homily, Father Richard observed how people of different faiths had come together to give thanks for Anne's life. He reflected how Anne had had a strong sense of the things which are hidden in life but which are nonetheless of the highest value, and practised selflessness and self-giving, putting her faith into action. Through her work with children and as a





volunteer in the community, she integrated her faith into her life, setting an example for us all.

Father Richard reminded us that while death had changed Anne this was not the end for her. He concluded by giving thanks for her gifts including her faith, and all that she was and remains.

Anne was buried in the churchyard close to her home. Our thoughts and prayers are with the family at this time.



ALPHA

As part of my training for lay ministry in the Mells group of churches, I'll be running 'Alpha' at the Village Hall in Great Elm this autumn. Anyone interested in engaging with Christian faith is invited to come.

Notes of Mells Parish Council meeting held on Tuesday September 9th, 2025

(Full minutes can be found at mells-pc.gov.uk SOMERSET COUNCIL - COUNCILLOR'S REPORT

AI Road Safety Cameras (Frome Bypass): Following six fatalities on the A361 Frome Bypass in five years, Somerset Council and Avon & Somerset Police are trialling AI cameras to detect dangerous driving. Installed in August for six months, the cameras identify behaviours linked to the "Fatal Five": speeding, seatbelt non-compliance, distraction (e.g. mobile phones), drink/drug driving and careless driving. Offenders will initially receive warning letters and educational materials.

Fire Risk from Gas Canisters: Somerset Council has issued a warning following a near-serious fire at a recycling facility caused by gas canisters being placed in blue recycling bags. The risk of explosion when crushed is high. Residents are urged to take small canisters, vapes, lithium-ion batteries and devices to recycling sites for safe disposal. Only empty aerosols may go in blue bags.

MATTERS ARISING

Pavilion lease and future of recreation ground: Awaiting further discussion between the Estate and the Directors.

Litter bin by bus shelter: The location of the bin has not been decided yet. **Frome Missing Link (cycle path):** The application for the grant has now been submitted.

HIGHWAY AND FOOTPATH ISSUES:

Speeding vehicles in Vobster: Clerk to apply for the survey to be undertaken and will advise Highways to consult with Cllr West. The issue is worse around 7.00am and 7.00pm, making it very hard to exit the driveways that open directly onto the main road through the village and unsafe for pedestrians.
